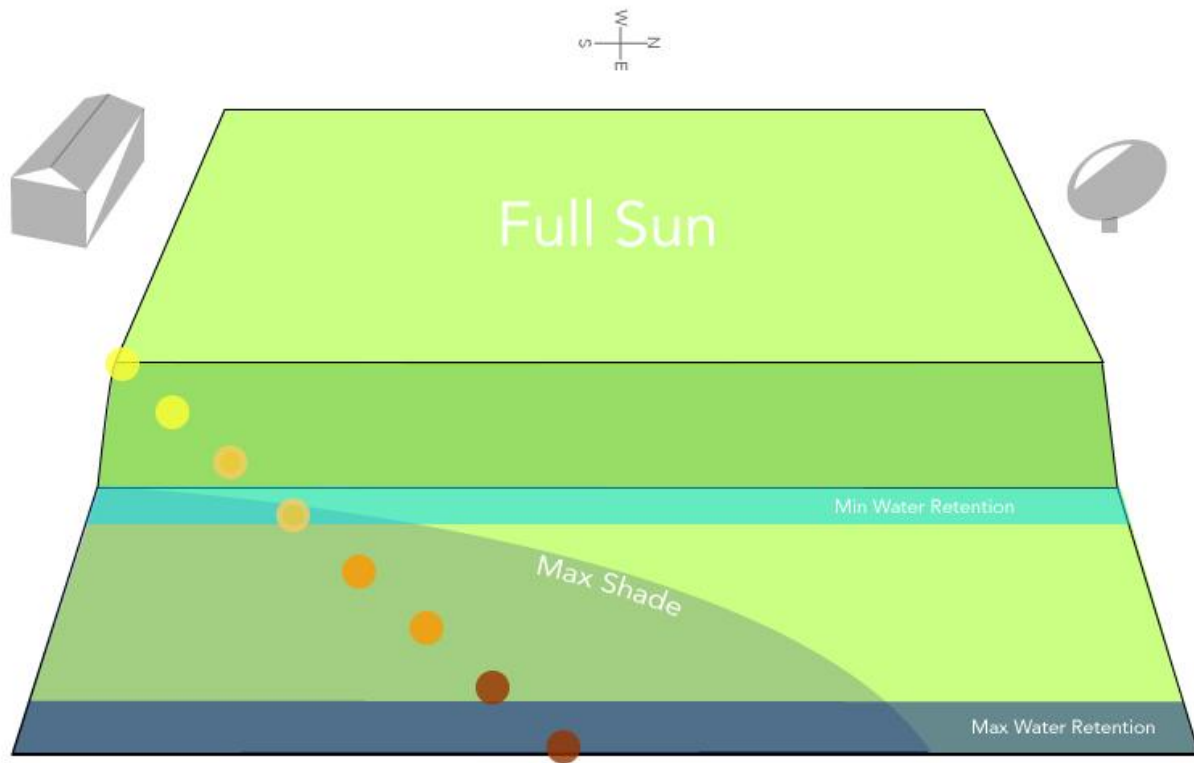

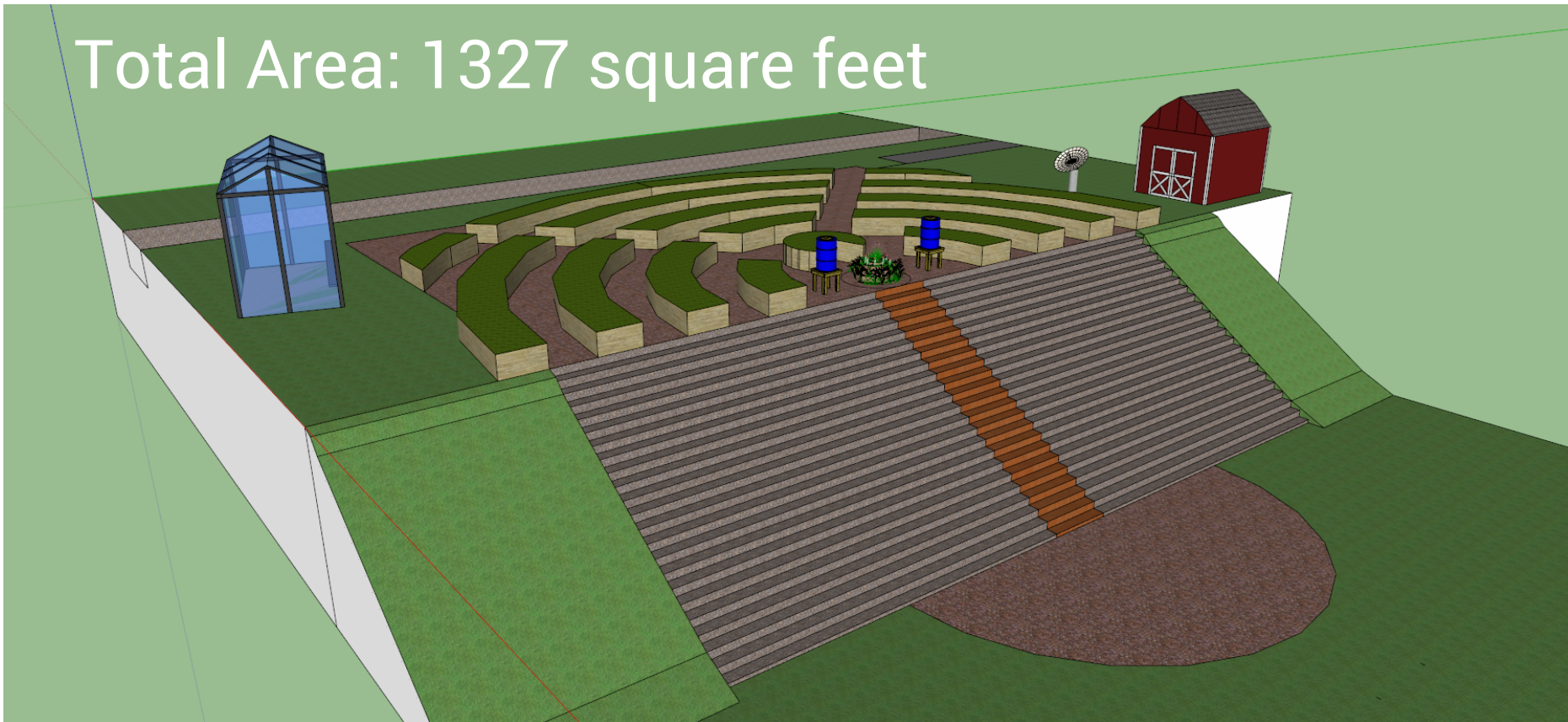

An Ecological Map



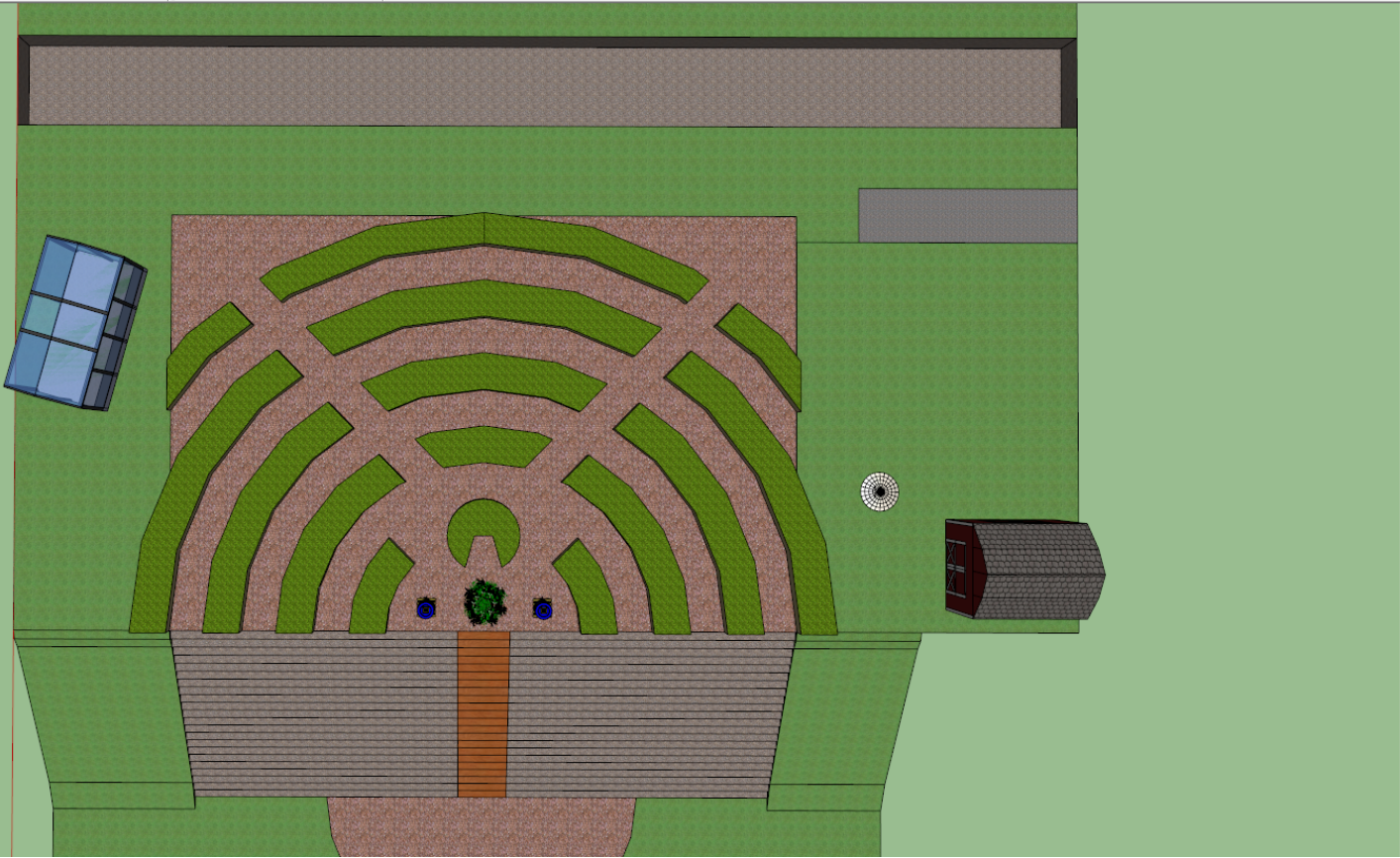
