Inspiration through education

Orphanage Without Walls (OWW) is a program organized by Children of Shambala, a registered foundation in Norway. The aim of the program is to provide social and financial support to impoverished orphans in Asia. Locally hired social workers serve as role models and foster family advocates, helping these children succeed in school and find their first paid jobs.







Orphanage Without Walls

Help Asian children who:

- are living below the UN poverty line
- have lost one or both of their parents
- will not have the chance to go to school without the support of OWW

How we help:

- connect children with a foster family within a local community
- provide basic living necessities to children in need
- pay for all costs associated with high school and vocational school tuition
- use local staff trained in social care to inspire and ensure the well being of each orphan
- provide educational enrichment programs to motivate and inspire

Why support Orphanage Without Walls over other programs?

- Highly cost efficient with minimum overhead costs. This is possible because all of our staff live and work in Asia and we have many volunteer staff members.
- There is no "fall back" option for the orphans in our program. Without our support their condition will most likely worsen significantly.
- We focus on maintaining local community networks with a familiar family rather than placing children in far-away orphanages.
- We believe human-to-human contact with children in our target areas is the most effective way to inspire them to succeed in school.
