Resumes

- What is the purpose of a resume?
- How about a cover letter?

What should be in a resume?

- Name, contact information
- Education (for now at top; later at bottom)
- Employment, including internships
- Projects, skills
- Extracurricular activities (especially professional societies and things that connect with your career interests)
- Keywords for the job you are applying to (as long as they are accurate!)

What not to include in your resume

- Objective (summary can be OK if it is focused)
- Picture
- SSN
- GPA (my opinion)

Resume format

- One page
- Serif font
- Reverse chronological listing
- Company, location, position/title, dates
 - What were your <u>accomplishments</u> and <u>contributions</u>?

Quick Guide to Job Hunting

Successful ways to get a job

- Network
- Network

- Internship → job after graduation (actually networking!)
- Career fairs
- Not applying to job postings

Why you shouldn't apply to job postings

- Automatic resume scanning rejects any that don't meet specific criteria, such as keywords, experience, skills, etc.
- Job postings get thousands of responses so it is unlikely that a person will even see your resume
- UNLESS...
- You have connected with someone in the company who will circumvent the system!

So what do I really mean?



- Find companies that you are interested in
 - Ones that make products or provide services that excite
- Find someone who works there through LinkedIn
 - Reach out and request 10-15 minutes to speak with them about the company. Ask why they like it there, advice for a new graduate about working in their field, etc.
 - YOU ARE NOT ASKING FOR A JOB!
 - You are interested in finding other people to speak to about engineering careers that they may know.

- Yes, you should have a complete profile and good picture
- Connect with me, Dean Bowman, other faculty and administrators that you actually know
- Keep it up to date
- Include internships, REUs, etc.
- Check regularly; "like" postings

Ways to find companies

- Google
- Dun & Bradstreet (Library)
- Standard & Poors (Library)
- Job postings (but only to find companies to investigate!)
- Industry publications
- Start ups?
 - SBIR grant awards
 - Venture capital deals

Beware the social media profile

- Companies will search for your online presence
- What do you have posted online?
- Pictures, language, etc.
- What would you not want your Grandmother to see?
